Nonprofit Groups Share in Grants from Community Foundations

Several nonprofit and charitable groups shared in grants from the Attica, Covington, and Southeast Fountain Community Foundations, all affiliates of the Western Indiana Community Foundation. Grant monies are made available by donations from caring individuals who want to make a difference by improving the quality of life for others.

The latest recipients are:



Covington Elementary School - \$4,000 for the Hoosier Summer School Program for an extensive day trip and overnight campout for 45 fourth and fifth graders to attend historical sites, manufacturing facilities, and places of interest pertinent to Indiana and the development of our state. In the past 28 years, over 1,000 CES students have been able to take advantage of this educational learning opportunity.

Community Action Program of Western Indiana - \$9,800 for sidewalk removal and replacement, including ADA ramps at housing unit in Covington for disabled citizens, seniors and other qualified families

Covington Buddy Bags - \$5,000 for the Buddy Bag weekend meal program for 90 students at Covington Elementary School, Head Start, and Covington Christian School

From the CEO's Desk



In October 2018, Lilly Endowment Inc. announced the seventh phase of its Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow (GIFT) initiative. Much like its forerunner, GIFT VII focuses on building unrestricted endowment assets (assets that can be used for practically any community purpose) as opposed to endowed assets designed to serve a specific purpose. GIFT VII is aimed to encourage residents and others to give generously to grow community foundation endowments and to fund local community programs and opportunities.

From now until December 31, 2020, Lilly Endowment Inc. is offering limited matching \$2-for-\$1 unrestricted funds, up to a cap of \$500,000 in Fountain County. In other words, your gift to an unrestricted endowment fund of \$25 will become \$75; \$100 instantly becomes \$300; and a gift of \$5,000 added to an existing unrestricted fund or used to create your own (such as a named family fund) becomes \$15,000! There has never been a better opportunity to impact your community!

Every dollar we receive makes an enormous difference. Unrestricted endowment funds with the Community Foundation allow us to award more competitive grants to our communities. These funds are vital in our efforts to strengthen Fountain County and fund programs and opportunities within these areas. The success of GIFT VII will position us to create an even greater impact in the communities we serve in perpetuity.

It is thanks to the generosity of those who create or give to unrestricted endowment funds that allows the Community Foundation to award community grants through its unrestricted grants process.

Community Action Program of Western Indiana - \$6,102 for summer camp scholarships for elementary and middle school students participating in the T.A.L.K. S. mentoring/youth leadership program from Attica and Covington Schools

Charles Forrest American Legion Post 288 - \$1,957 annual payout from endowment fund of which a portion will be used to support youth applicants to Hoosier Boys State and Hoosier Girls State in June

Every 15 Minutes Program – Fountain Central High School - \$1,500 for an event designed to dramatically instill teenagers with the potentially dangerous consequences of drinking alcohol and texting while driving. This program challenges students to think about drinking, texting while driving, personal safety, and the responsibility of making mature decisions when lives are involved.

Journey Bags include such items as baby wash, diapers, rattles, pajamas, blankets, socks, underwear and stuffed animals – provided by the Southeast Fountain, Covington, and Attica Community Foundations.

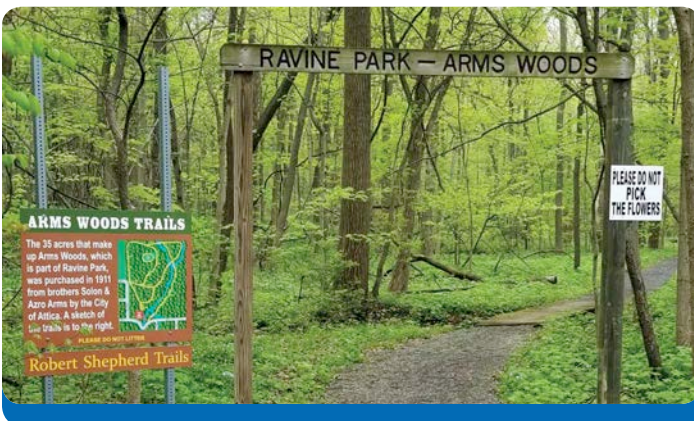


CFL Rescue Sanctuary - \$1,200 for the purchase of four new dog kennels

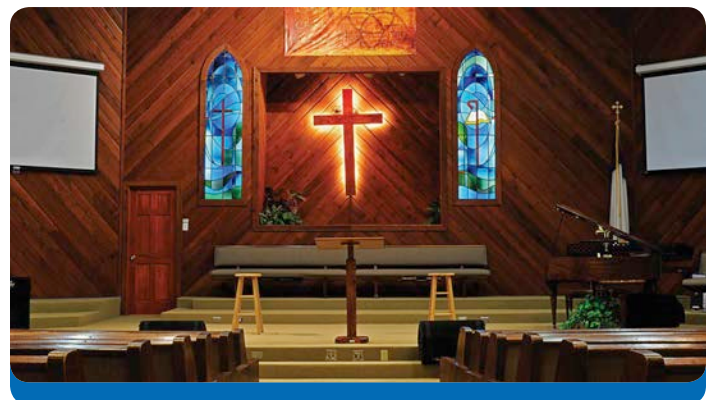

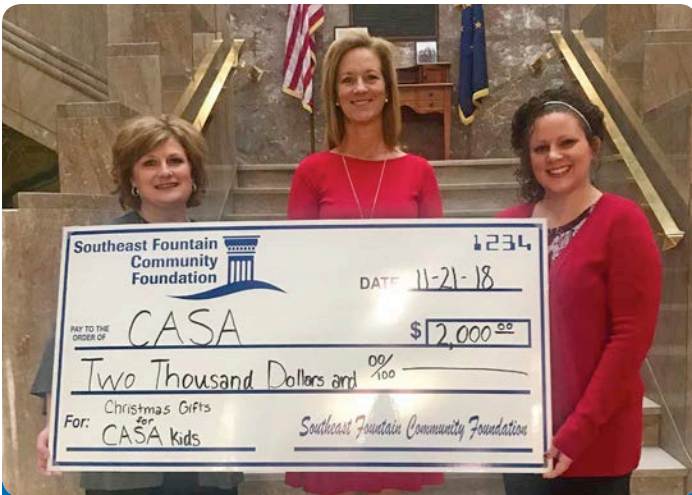

Grant Guidelines

Grant Focus

Western Indiana Community Foundation focuses on local needs within the geographical boundaries of Fountain County with consideration given to the areas of health, charitable service, education, cultural affairs, and community improvement.

All endowment funds, which stipulate in the fund agreement the areas to be supported from the income earned on the fund assets, will be honored regardless of location of the grant recipient.

Grant Review

The Board of Directors will review each grant request in preparation for its regular board meeting. Grant applications may be submitted at any time throughout the year. Applicants will be notified immediately following the Board of Directors' decision.

The Western Indiana Community Foundation is especially interested in learning of plans for:

- Startup costs for new programs
- Capital needs beyond an applicant's capabilities
- One time projects or needs

The Western Indiana Community Foundation will not consider:

- Individuals except for scholarships
- Organizations for political or religious purposes
- Support for regular operating budgets
- Contributions to endowments
- Long-term funding
- Post-event situations
- Apparel such as school/sport uniforms

Taking Hold of the Future

With an effective estate plan, you can provide future economic security for yourself, your family, and others you wish to benefit. Read on for more about building an estate plan.

Answers to Frequently Asked Questions

What is estate planning?

In its broadest sense, estate planning involves making provisions for the present and future management of the property you have accumulated, and deciding how you want it distributed when you no longer need it.

What if I do not make an estate plan?

The state where you live will furnish one. Your state's plan cannot:

- Provide for your heirs according to their needs.
- Take into account who you would have wanted to be the legal guardian of your minor children.
- Provide for special friends or charitable interests.

How do I begin to create an estate plan?

A good place to start is with the four P's.

- List the **people** you would like to provide for in your plans. You may wish to include charitable interests.
- List the **property** you own and any income it produces. Include investments, real estate, retirement plan funds, and life insurance assets, as well as personal property.
- Your **plans** will begin to take shape as you consider how you wish to provide for the people on your list. Study your property list carefully, looking for opportunities to match the needs of each person.
- List the **planners** you will need to help you – your attorney, accountant, financial planner, bank trust officer, etc. Consider asking your most trusted advisor to help coordinate the process.

How can I make charitable gifts in my estate plans?

You can make gifts from funds that remain after you have first assured your family's financial well-being. You can accomplish this through a bequest in your will, a trust gift, naming a charity to receive life insurance or retirement plan proceeds, or other charitable designations.

Is there a way I can enjoy tax savings and other benefits from charitable gifts now?

Yes! With income gift plans, you can receive payments for life or another specified period of time. You can then make a charitable gift of assets that remain when you no longer need the payments. Income tax deductions are allowed for such gifts when completed during your lifetime.

If you fund income gifts with securities that have increased in value over the years, you could reduce and/or delay capital gains tax on the assets. It can also be possible to receive payments that are free of tax or taxed at lower rates than other income. You enjoy the satisfaction of making a thoughtful gift as well as the benefit of attractive fixed or variable payments and immediate tax savings.

With a long-term horizon, the Foundation investment philosophy prioritizes the preservation of the original donor gift. Donations are invested (with the exception of pass-through funds) in order to create an annual stream of income which is distributed to the charitable organizations, scholarship recipients or the purpose as designated by the donor.

A large number of endowed funds that donors created with the Foundation are given as unrestricted grants, which means the Foundation has discretion to grant those annual earnings to meet the community needs in the areas designated by the donor. We call these funds Unrestricted Funds or Community Funds. The Foundation holds more than 30 of these funds (of our total of 305 funds). Earnings of more than \$265,000 are distributed from these 30 funds annually.

Financial News

Did you know WICF currently manages \$22,079,603.72 (3/31/19) in charitable assets for the benefit of area communities and citizens? The assets are invested and a portion of the earnings each year are used to award grants to area non-profit organization and community projects and for student scholarships.

Did you know WICF has once again been ranked among the top community foundations in the state of Indiana according to the annual 2017 CF Insights survey. The survey compiled data from participating community foundations across the state and acts as “the annual census of the community foundation field.”

Of the various categories in the survey, WICF ranked:

Silver Island Cemetery Fund

Silver Island Cemetery Fund has served as a final resting place for area citizens since 1832 and is a historic cemetery listed in *Indiana's Cemetery and Burial Grounds Registry of the Indiana Department of Natural Resources.*

Silver Island Cemetery is a nice, quiet county cemetery surrounded by fields, and is the currently the final resting place of over 500 interments. There is a large amount of area history and countless personal memories – of family, friends, husbands, wives, and children – contained in Silver Island Cemetery with burial sites still available.

Daily upkeep and ongoing maintenance are required to care for the cemetery to combat deterioration by preserving, beautifying, and maintaining abandoned or deteriorating graves and for the care and replacement of trees, flowers, shrubbery, etc. Also, the fund will assist in providing an educational benefit to the general public and promote appreciation for community history by maintaining, repairing, and restoring monuments, headstones, and grave markers of historical or architectural significance.
