For farmers, a gift of grain offers a meaningful and tax-efficient way to support charitable causes. Instead of selling grain and donating the proceeds, farmers can donate the grain itself directly to a charity. This simple yet powerful gesture provides several key benefits.

Tax Advantages: When farmers donate grain, they can avoid including the sale in their income, potentially reducing their federal, state, and self-employment taxes. This means more of the donation goes to the charity, while the farmer benefits from a lower taxable income. Since the grain is donated before it's sold, the farmer can also deduct expenses related to growing the crop, such as seed, fertilizer, and irrigation.



New Funds

The endowment funds listed below have recently been established by local organizations, businesses, and/or caring citizens. Any individual, business, or organization can establish a fund and/or contribute to an existing fund at any time.

Donations made to these endowment funds are invested and a portion of the earnings is used to award grants to community organizations and/or to award scholarships to students for their post-high school education. Donations can be made in a variety of forms including gifts of cash, stock, real estate, life insurance, and charitable bequests.

Endowment funds can be established in honor or memory of loved ones for as little as \$1,000. Payouts ("distributions") from endowment funds begin when the fund has reached \$10,000 in cumulative donations and has been invested for one full calendar year.

As you plan your year-end gifts for 2024, consider these key points.

Cash Gifts Lead the Way

Cash gifts remain common, whether by check or online. Gifts made before December 31 may offer tax savings if you itemize. This year, you can deduct cash gifts up to 60% of your adjusted gross income.

Noncash Gifts Offer Tax Savings

Noncash gifts, such as stocks and mutual funds, are popular. Giving appreciated securities held for over a year allows you to avoid capital gains tax and claim a deduction. Real estate, cryptocurrency, art, and other property can also be donated, but special rules apply.

Retirement Plans: Give Now or Later

Retirement funds like 401(k)s and IRAs are excellent sources for charitable gifts. IRA owners 701/2 or older can make qualified charitable distributions (QCDs) of up to \$105,000 (\$210,000 for couples) in 2024. QCDs are tax-free.

- ▶ Insurance Policies: Outdated policies can be donated for a tax deduction.
- Financial Accounts: You can name a charity as a beneficiary for various accounts.
